

The Call to Salvation Is Universal

Hello my dear friends. Once again, MERRY CHRISTMAS and HAPPY NEW YEAR 2022!!! The feast of the Epiphany provokes in our hearts a very big happiness. Today's gospel tells us the story of the magi. They saw a star that announced the birth of a new king. They left everything to go meet Him. They went on the way and prostrated themselves before Him and they did Him homages. These magi are the first gentiles (pagans) who come to adore the Son of God. The light that shines in the night of Bethlehem will radiate up to the extremities of the world. On the other hand, Jesus himself will say one day: "*I am the light of the world; whoever follows me will not walk in darkness.*"

What we must understand very well is that God always makes the first step towards us. In the story of magi, it is Him who made the first move, giving the sign of the star. Because "*it is first God who looks for the man, before the man does the first step.*" Then the magi answered to an inner powerful call. They went on the way to understand what this new star means. *God uses signs to call us.* And if He acts like this, it is because He loved us first. He offers himself to everyone.

Then the Feast of the Epiphany reminds us that God calls all the men and women. Through the magi who come to the manger, it is all the people of the entire world who are invited. The Old Testament says to us that God compromised himself with a precise people, the people of Israel. But choosing Israel as a nation for his covenant, God does not forget other nations of the world. The foreigners have a place also in his heart. He wants us to recognize ourselves as brothers and sisters. It is the mission that Jesus entrusts to his apostles in the day of the Ascension: "*go all over the world. Proclaim the Good News to the whole creation.*" (*Mark 16:15*)

Now then, we understand well that the racism against the foreigners is absolutely opposite to the Gospel. We cannot at the same time announce the Good News of the Gospel and reject our brothers and sisters. All the men and women including the biggest sinners can find their place in the caravan of the magi. This Sunday of Epiphany, God draws our attention. One day, Jesus said: "*I Am the way*"; *this means that our life is a journey.* We are on our way through the heavenly Father; and Jesus is there every day to guide us by his Word. His Eucharist is offered us to strengthen us.

The problem is that most of the time, we are as the people of Jerusalem who did not come to the manger of Bethlehem. The Light shines always, but we do not look at it. Instead of being open to God and to the others, we protect ourselves, we enclose ourselves; it is the sign of a closed world. *And that is awful and very sad.* The feast of Epiphany is there to invite us to go out, to go through others and through the Lord. In today's gospel, we see the GENTILES (pagans), who look for God and they go up to the end of their search to do homage to the newborn king of the Jews, to adore Him as the Son of God.

On this day, we pray you Lord: "*Light of the world, we walk towards you. Son of God, you will save us.*" Amen.

and icon of hope, pray for us.






