On the way of hope, we owe you all our exploits: Glory to you, Lord Jesus!

My dear friends, at the beginning of Holy Week, we reached the hour of Christ's Passover. He knows that his hour has arrived. It will be the time for him to leave this world and return to the Father through his death and resurrection. He, the Son of God, wanted to live in the truth of his human condition: he experienced suffering, humiliation, and anguish in front of death. On the cross, we heard Him utter this great cry: **"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"** These words end up with a cry of trust: **"Father, in your hands I commend my spirit."**

In this account of the Passion, we see that he is free to let himself be arrested. He had always refused to be a king of this world. Today is his last ascent to Jerusalem, and he comes to give him a special solemnity. It is a sign that he addresses us. This solemn entry into the Holy City announces his return to the Father, in the heavenly Jerusalem. He will be acclaimed by all those he saves and leads to him. We are all called to be part of this huge crowd who acclaims its Savior.

On this day we follow Christ who initiates the drama of his Passion and death. He needs us to stay with him, even if it is for a short hour. He needs Simon of Cyrene to carry all the crosses of our suffering mankind. He needs the centurions to recognize him as the Son of God. Living this holy week is a commitment to every day and every moment. The account of the Passion we have just heard stops at the well-guarded tomb. But death will not have the last word. Together with the women and apostles who saw the risen Jesus, we are sent to be witnesses of life stronger than death. In this way, we are called to follow Jesus up to the end, even to his death on the cross. So let us not be afraid to tell our world that violence, suffering, and death will not have the last word.

We are all destined for Life.

We pray to you Lord, accompany us every day with the joys and difficulties of life. We want to live in communion with you and our brothers and sisters forever and ever. Amen.
